Scott is a graduate of OSU, where he studied agriculture/ruminant (animal) nutrition and also holds an MBA from Northwestern University. He has made his career in the animal nutrition business, and continues today as part of CSA Animal Nutrition, based in Dayton.

Muffet holds a degree in allied medical professions. She worked in the field for 10 years until the birth of the couple's oldest daughter when she chose to become a full-time mom and homemaker. She has served at the New Path Food Pantry in Tipp City for more than 20 years.

The couple lived in Ashland, Ohio; Mason City, Iowa; and Naperville, Illinois, before moving to Tipp City to fulfill a desire to raise their daughters, ages three and eight at the time, in a "small town" environment.

"The community of Tipp City with its culture, schools, churches and friendly people matched our goals, and we loved it as soon as we discovered it.
